Jutes

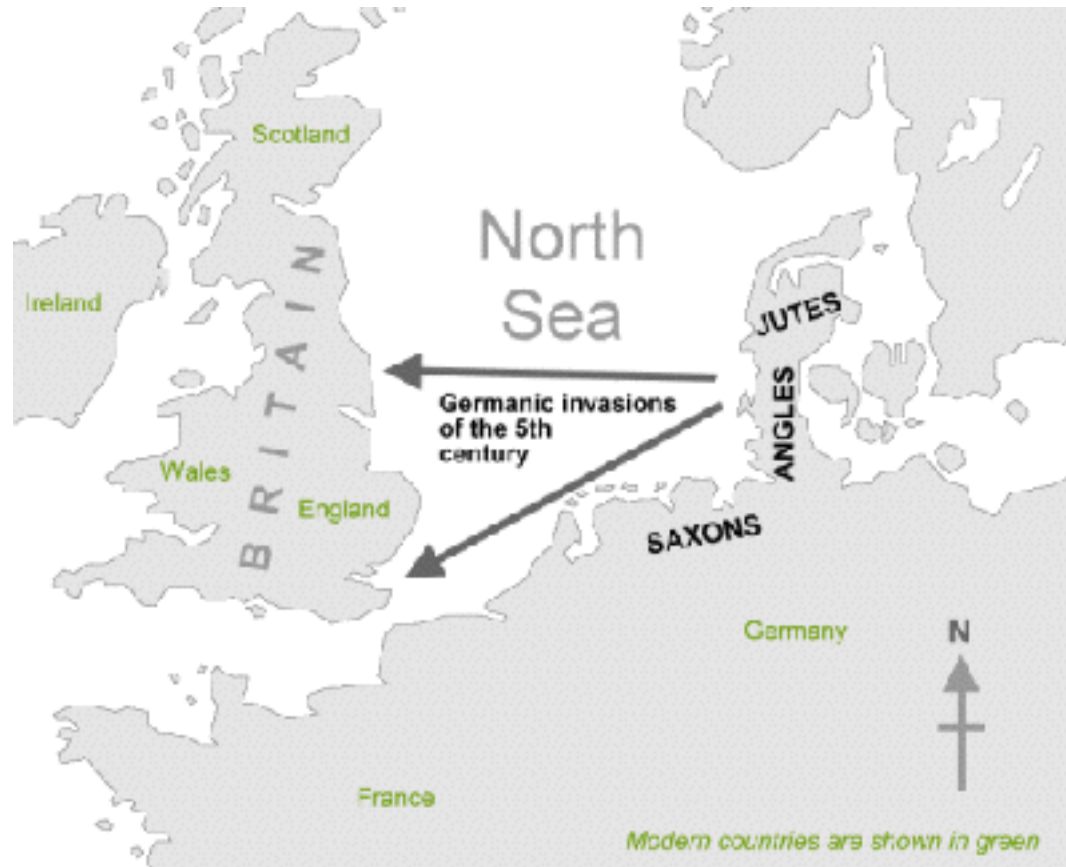
